The CommandIQ App allows you to manage the people, places and things that connect to your home Wi-Fi network if you have a Gigacenter or Gigaspire Router (cube-shaped box with no antenna).


What does the CommandIQ app do?

For future sustainability, we evolved to more than just the telephone, with the co-op now offering Gig services, computer services, networking, wireless, home security, web hosting and IT services. His foresight and leadership have enabled our members to be connected and to participate in the broadband driven digital world of today and tomorrow. On-going education and participating at industry events have enabled Joe to learn, grow and foster change as technology has evolved for the telecommunications industry. Joe has been very active with the statewide Carolina-Virginias Telephone Membership Association serving as Past President and Director for many years.

Your bracket will be available to complete after Selection Sunday, when the NCAA announces


which teams will be participating in the tournament at the beginning of March; and, will be open for picks until five minutes before the first game of the tournament. No one may submit a bracket after that deadline.
